



How to Figure the Cost of Transferring

1. What you pay the seller for his or her confirmed entry slot is between you and the seller.
2. Find out what the seller paid for their entry by checking the confirmed entry list.
3. Select your event cost from this table:

4. Add \$10 if you do not have a current USAT license.
5. Add \$20 additional for the transfer fee.
6. Your cost is the total of steps 3, 4 and 5 less the seller's cost from step 2.
7. A check, money order or credit card authorization for this amount together with a completed buyer's registration form must be received by September 17, 2009, at Carpinteria Triathlon, P.O. Box 6616, Santa Barbara, CA 93160. Make the check or money order payable to City of Carpinteria.

Example1: Seller paid \$70 for the Sprint Youth event (no USAT license) and offers spot for \$70. Buyer is youth with USAT license who wants to enter the Olympic Youth event. There is still room in the Olympic event so the buyer pays the seller \$70. The buyer's cost of transferring is $70 + 0$ (has license) $+ 20$ (transfer fee) $- 70$ (already paid) = \$20.

Example2: Seller paid \$195 for an adult relay team with only one USAT member. Two of the seller's team cannot compete (swimmer without USAT license and runner with USAT license). Seller offers spots for a swimmer and runner for \$126.66. Two buyers get together, contact the seller and pay his asking price. Neither buyer has a license so their cost of transferring is $175 + 2 \times 10$ (one day licenses) $+ 20$ (transfer fee) $= 205 - 175 = \$40$

¹ To replace one team member the cost is one third of the total, i.e. \$58.33 for adults and \$36.67 for youths.
